Regulation in shrimp farming

- Budhi
 - Can the standard certificate refer to CBIB?
- Coco
 - If it needs a license from KLHK, maybe that should be adjusted into a recommendation letter by KLHK
 - The people under the legal department do not understand well the issue in the field, need to set a better strategy to address that to MMA/DGA
- Bambang Widigdo
 - Due to the unsure agencies to manage a specific license, most of the time agencies are pointing here and there without clarity
 - If that is clearly stated it will be managed by a third party, that will make it easier
- Joko
 - On some licenses, farmers have asked the third party to manage that, for instance for the generator and IPAL license
 - This third party has a close relation to the environmental agencies
- Coco
 - Propose that the licenses are managed by:
 - BKPN: through the OSS system
 - MMA: through the representatives at the regional level
- Haris
 - Agree on the idea that the standard certificate refers to CBIB, including additional regulation that is not covered yet
- Budhi
 - That can be negotiated through the CBIB department at DGA, or through the Coordinating Ministry for Maritime and Investment Affairs

- The reduction from 21 licenses into 2 means that, the process is managed by 2 agencies

Thematic seminar

- Budhi
 - 2 thematic seminar are scheduled
 - Polychaeta production
 - Wastewater treatment management
 - Seminar on Polychaeta production
 - Two speakers have confirmed
 - Agung Setyarto (from primalarva)
 - Adit (Indonesian master degree student focusing research on Polychaeta production)
 - Suggest to charge a participation fee? IDR 50,000/ person?
 - Scheduled at the end of March
- Pamudi
 - Currently in coordination with the CBIB team at DGA for the IndoGAP transition; may help on the standard certificate discussion
 - Waste water treatment seminar
 - Required the speaker to prepare the material as follows;
 - Water quality for shrimp farming
 - Waste water management design, technology, and provide samples on system adoption in the field
 - Closed system for intensive shrimp farming
 - Scheduled between 20-30 April
- Budhi
 - That may need an expert from the local Indonesian
- Coco
 - Under the DGA, most of the expert are more on the research and development stage
 - May need to invite expert from the other agencies such as the Ministry of Public Works and Public Housing, or the PDAM (regional state owned enterprise)
- Bambang
 - It needs to consider the cost for water purification, so it does not burdensome to the production cost. Otherwise, there will still difficulties for farmer to adopt the system
